

# Field Guide - Visitor Guidelines

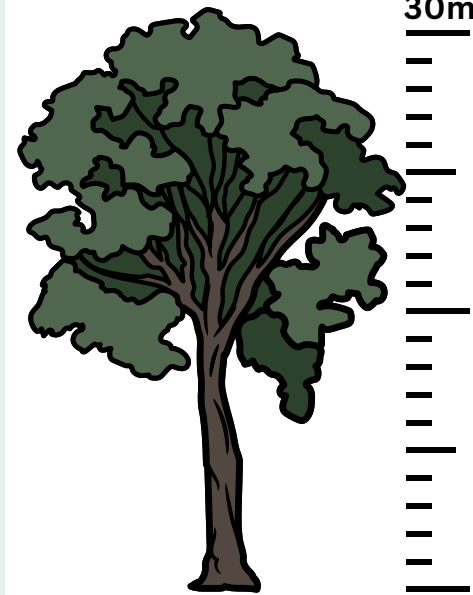
Forest operations such as harvesting have specific controls in place to protect the safety of people who come into contact with them, and minimise any potential risks.

## To assist we have provided some common guidelines:

- Do not enter a forest operation worksite unless you have made radio contact (UHF radio), have permission to enter or are accompanied by a site contact.
  - Do not proceed through worksite unless operator confirms permission.
  - A visitor should be inducted onto the site, making them aware of all safety and emergency information.
  - Visitors must follow all signage and instructions given by the site contacts, including PPE, all controls to manage risks and Safe Work Procedures.
  - Always maintain Safe Work Zones.
- Always stay with the site contact unless given permission otherwise.
  - While on the worksite visitors are to maintain communications, whether using site contacts nominated UHF channel, mobile phone or visual contact.
  - If a visitor is to be out of contact for any period of time, they must first advise the site contact as to where they will be while out of contact.
  - When leaving the worksite, or returning after a period out of contact, the visitor should always advise the operator.
  - The visitor has a duty to report anything unsafe or any hazards.
  - If you are ever unsure, ask the site contact for clarification.

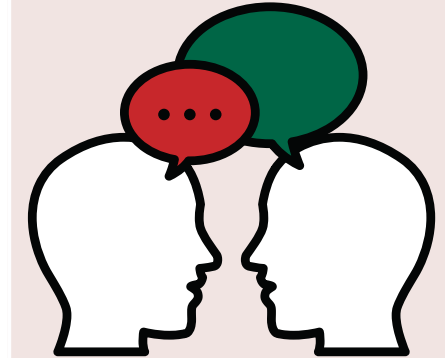

## KEY GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER



Stay a minimum of TWO tree lengths away (>60m)

If you are unsure about anything in on the site or in the site induction, then ask questions



Communicate and maintain visual contact



Always maintain communications

Stop at the designated signs, and obey all signage

Do not proceed through worksite unless operator provides permission
